MORNING TIME

Tell your kids a story about an extended family member who had a unique talent or someone who made a difference. Encourage them to use their own unique gifts today.



MEAL TIME

Ask a kid: What are your talents or gifts?

Ask a parent: Why do you think God gave us unique gifts and talents?



DRIVE TIME

Use the Parent Cue app to watch this month's music video. What do you think makes you an original? Talk about ways your kid can use his individuality now instead of waiting



BED TIME

Read Acts 16:1-5. Who are people around your family who can help you discover your gifts? Pray and thank God for each of those people.



PARENT TIME

Parenting is filled with "ah-ha" moments. For example, there are times when, as parents, we notice talents in our kids. Maybe you notice their ability to be creative and artistic. You knew from the moment your kid was able to hold a paintbrush that he or she would love to paint, color, and draw. But when you visit the school on parent-teacher night, something takes you by surprise ... the teacher rants about your kid's ability to think strategically and do math problems like nobody's business. The teacher noticed a talent in your kid that you didn't notice. Talk about an "ah-ha" moment.

That's why it's so important to invite other people to speak into your kids' lives. Small group leaders, coaches, and teachers can help kids develop their gifts and talents beyond what parents can do. Other trusted adults can show

your kids how to use their talents to make a difference. At times, you may be the spectators admiring your kids' gifts in action, allowing God to use other people to help your kids grow.
